

Journey to Revalidation

Where are we now?



- Revalidation process is now underway with plans to complete all doctors within three years
- You should all know your revalidation date by now, you can register with GMC on line to confirm the date
- Let your appraiser know your revalidation date
- The mandatory components are known :50 credits , two significant events , review of complaints and one PDP per year. One colleague, one patient feedback and one quality improvement activity per revalidation cycle.
- You can defer your revalidation if there are good reasons, but you cannot work without being revalidated
- Your appraiser will need to satisfy the RO (through Local Area Team LAT) that you have presented the necessary evidence in the appraisal before your revalidation.
- If your appraisal is satisfactory revalidation will take place without further input from you
- If more evidence is required the RO will request further information
- Remember to show evidence of reflection
- If you claim impact make sure you have justified this
- Bring issues that CCG, or LAT or RO have asked you to discuss at your appraisal

- Keep a copy of each year's appraisal as currently you can't access last year's appraisal documents on RCGP eportfolio
- Appraisers are appraised by Lead appraiser, our lead appraiser is Dr Anne Shepherd
- Our RO is Dr Andrew Folks
